Brief Synopsis of the Study

Parkinson Disease (PD)	Standard of Care: (1) Neurologist assessment and treatment (2) Neurologist referral to one of the following: (a) Partial Therapies (b) PD Interdisciplinary Team No referrals for therapy

The purpose of this study is to determine the feasibility of conducting a large, multi-centered study to compare the quality of life of Parkinson disease (PD) patients based on the type of study treatment they receive as part of their standard of care.

Who is eligible to participate in the study?

Age: 21-85yrs

Gender: Male and Female

To qualify patients must have a documented diagnosis of idiopathic Parkinson Disease, be seen for their PD by a neurologist at the Plummer Movement Disorders Center at S&W, be able to walk, and be in middle stage of the disease process.

Atypical Parkinsonism patients will be excluded.

What may be involved/required for subject participation? (Visits, tests and/or logs, etc.)

Qualifying patients will be asked to complete a Parkinson's disease Quality of Life Questionnaire (PDQ-39) and a brief demographic survey at the first study visit. Six months later they will be asked to complete the PDQ-39 questionnaire a second time. Participants will receive a \$20 Wal-Mart gift card at the completion of each study visit to compensate them for their time.
